I studied painting, life drawing, art history, and finished all the required classes for my doctorate in three years. However, I spent more time creating art than conducting research in the chemistry lab. So they booted me out of the chemistry program with a MS degree. After finishing my BFA in Painting, I wanted to get the hell out of Oklahoma.

So,I applied to graduate programs only on the East coast....

I ended up in Providence Rhode Island. I loved teaching at Brown University, while attending Rhode Island School of Design. I was adjunct Professor of Painting at Providence College, after graduating from RISD. The pay was lousy, and so, I reluctantly went back into Chemistry, to pay off my massive student loans. I worked as a pharmaceutical scientist for the Division of Cancer Prevention, National Cancer Institute. I developed drugs for clinical trials to prevent cancer. I painted and created collages in the evenings. I retired and moved to Portland Maine in 2007. Currently, I am a full-time artist, residing in Bridgton Maine. This will be my third year, teaching painting to a small group of individuals, organized by the Naples Library. It is challenging and rewarding to teach beginners, intermediate, and advance students at the same time.

My primary concern in painting is the process itself and color. I am not concerned with the outcome. I view all my paintings on paper as experiments. My art studio is my laboratory. I developed my paintings in layers of color. Currently, I employ images from nature, and symbols of technology, freedom, and diagrams of instructions in my works.


